
Letter from Tom

Yo Gang:



Recently I drove a 928 on the Autobahn. At 200(kph not mph!) in fourth gear it cruises quite easily with plenty of power and an extra gear to really show its stuff. Around town the double dry clutch makes smooth shifts a tricky "get used to it" challenge. On a back road at 100kph in third gear I came up upon a tortoise of a car. Down shift to second, stomp it, check the rear view mirror and the tortoise appears to be going in reverse! Quite a thrill and reminiscent of a Gumball Rally scene.


TR Drag Coefficients

Dear Triumph Enthusiast,

The Second Southeastern Regional Vintage Triumph Meet, will be held November 1-3, 1985 at Road Atlanta in Gainsville, Georgia. This will be sponsored by the Georgia Triumph Association and held in conjunction with Southeast Vintage Racing Association's, Vintage Grand Prix.

Last years meet was highly successful and a lot of fun. Triumphs and Triumph owners were present from North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Mississippi, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Florida. The Florida club especially, turned out in force. Maybe they are the club to try and beat this year. There were 43 motorcars in the Concours in 1984 and we expect many more in 1985.

This years events will include:

- 1. Track time on Friday morning. This is 30 minutes of open track time. You are required to have seat belts, an approved helmet, and your car must be safety inspected. There will be an additional charge for this event. Last year seven cars participated in the open track time. Some took a leisurely drive around the track while others made the turns a little faster. There was plenty of room for more cars on the track, so let's hear from some of you that want to get out on the track.
- 2. Rallye Saturday morning will begin with a short rallye to the track. This will be a seat-of-your-pants rallye. Nothing exceptionally difficult, just a lot of fun.
- 3. Councours Saturday morning will also find the Triumphs in all their elegance, ready to be judged in a participant judged contest. Each registered participant will receive one ballot and will be able to vote for each class. Bonnets must be open to enter your motorcar in this event.
- 4. Photo Contest Preferably 8X10 or larger, either color or black and white. Each photo must include all or part of a Triumph. You can enter as many photos as you like.

- 5. Poster Contest Bring your favorite Triumph poster and enter it in the judging.
- 6. Model Contest Bring your favorite Triumph model and enter it in the judging. You can enter as many models as you wish. No limitation on scale.
- 7. Name the part Test your skill in identifing parts.
- 8. Trivia contest Just how much do you know about Triumphs.
- 9. Hood up Hood down contest. How fast can you get your top down and back up.
- 10. TR3 hand crank contest. If you have never tried it, now is the time to start practicing.
- 11. Banquet Saturday will end with a banquet at the Holiday Inn. Awards will be made during the banquet, and their will be a drawing for door prizes. Everyone is invited to attend.
- 12. Sunday will open with a club tour of the track. This is fun for the more timid of us that would like to get out on the track, but not at 100 MPH. The rest of the day will be open for watching and enjoying the Atanta Vintage Grand Prix.

We have again invited The Roadster Factory to attend, and they have indicated they will provide us the opportunity of spending our money all weekend on wonderful and absolutly necessary Triumph parts. Last year they filled a 40 X 60 foot room with 1200 parts. Talk about a bunch of kids in a candy store.

I have enclosed information of the Holiday Inn, Gainsville, and post-cards to be used for registering. You must use these cards in order to receive the room discounts. Reservations are recommended since many people without reservations found "no room at the Inn", and had to drive several miles to the nearest motel. The cost of the rooms are \$41.00 for a single and \$45.00 for a double. Fifty rooms have been blocked for our use. These will remain blocked until September 31, 1985. Reservations must be made prior to this date to assure a room will be available.

The cost for registration this year will be \$35.00 per person and \$50.00 per couple if you pre-register by October 18, 1985. After this date the cost will be \$45.00 per person and \$60.00 per couple. Children under twelve are admitted free. The registration fee includes a three day pass for each registrant into Road Atlanta, one t-shirt, one dash plaque, eligibility to enter all events, and eligibility for all door prizes. Additional t-shirts will be for sale in the hospi-

tality room. An awards banquet will be held on Saturday night. This will be a buffet dinner and the cost will be \$11.00 per adult and \$5.00 for children under eight year of age. The cost for track time is set by the SVRA and has yet to be established. The cost last year was \$25.00 for one half hour on the track. A limited number cars will be allowed on the track. If there are more participants than the track will allow, a lottery will be held on Thursday night. Last year there was space available on the track for many more cars.



It is the Chapter's intent to publish an artistically appealing photographic representation of each of the TR series, from the T.R. 2 through the TR-8. We anticipate marketing the project through VTR and interested parts houses.

Rules of Participation

- 1. Only colour slides or colour prints may be submitted.
- Your TR must be painted very close to the original colour.
- There should be no people, pets or recognizable landmarks in the background.
- 4. Do not use any special effect filters.
- 5. The deadline for entries is December 31, 1985. Selections will be completed by the judging committee by March 31, 1986.

Suggestions

- 1. Take several different photographs of your TR.
 Change angles and backgrounds. A three-quarter
 angle shot is to be preferred. Try shots both with
 and without the hood (top).
- Select the most pleasing, least distractive, natural background that you can. Please give this much attention.
- 3. Keep the TR as original in appearance as possible.
- 4. Consider removing your car tags. Those of particular interest to your TR may be left on.
- 5. The best suggestion is to study other photos and car posters and note what makes them pleasing. Pay close attention to detail.

We encourage all TR owners to consider contributing photographs to this project as we will need a good balance of angles and colours on the poster. We can do this only if we have a large response. Each owner's name, of course, will be displayed in small print beneath each photograph selected for the poster.


