# Inexpensive Gear Reduction Starter By Charlie Durning

Those who have this malady will understand, I cannot leave well enough alone. I can't just repair if I see a way to improve. Well this time it's the starter on the Morris.


Though the starter on the Morris is OK, I really like the gear reduction starter I have on the Chick Magnette. I reasoned a gear reduction starter could be an improvement. What I didn't like about it is the cost. Another issue I found is some of the converted starters have issues with the adaptor flange breaking. There must be another way if I could read between the lines.

I did do some research. In doing so I ran into to the usual naysaying purists, and those who have their favored supplier of expensive adapted starters. During the process I stumbled upon a piece submitted by the MG Experience moderator from 4 years ago where he suggested using a Denso starter for an Isuzu Trooper. To my surprise there was no follow up conversation. HMMM I decided to look into this.

Using that information a whole world of possibilities opened up. Some of the info was confusing, to say the least. In spite of that, I decided to take the plunge. It came down to 2 possible starters. A part number 16878 identified with a tin end cover and 17155 with a cast end cover. As near as I can tell most of the folks who convert starters use a starter like the 16878. Further research revealed that most of the complaints for premature failure looked like starters based upon the 16878. I found very few complaints on starters based upon starters like the 17155. The starter on the Chick Magnette looks similar to the 17155, so I chose that version.

As for availability, my local NAPA store stocks both starters. That is a good thing. I bought the 17155. The cost including the core charge is less than ½ of the converted starter and about the same as a "crash" starter. I also found that it is available on eBay and Amazon.

The complaint about the 17155 starter is a shallow pinion engagement on the fly-wheel ring gear. That is a concern I wanted to investigate. Since I have a Midget engine in the shed I mounted the starter on that engine to see for myself. When compared to the wear pattern on the original "crash" starter the engagement looked to be similar. I'm satisfied with what I found.









Next step was to work out the electrical connections since they are different. The new starter has an integral solenoid whereas the solenoid for the "crash" starter is remote. That is resolved by making a jumper wire to go between the large stud where the battery cable would connect and the solenoid terminal.

That way the original solenoid will be retained. The other electrical issue is that the starter end of the battery cable has a 90 degree bend and the new starter would use a straight connection. Not a problem. I just put the 90 degree end on the remote solenoid and the straight end on the starter.





The starter installed with ease. The pilot is correct for the Morris and the bolt holes are in the correct place, just like it was made for the Morris. Further, there is plenty of room all around the starter so no other modifications are necessary.

The acid test is: Will it work? Yep it did.

In the end, the Morris is treated to a modern 1.2kw gear reduction starter without the expense of a converted starter and no issues with possible conversion flange failure.



Will this starter work on other BMC products that use the "crash" starter? I have no idea, but this or a similar starter just might be worth the investigation.

Our video his week takes you back, way back. Back to the 1930s when MGs were fierce competitors in racing around Europe and the world, and the Midget, the original Midget, was the car to beat. This film, titled "The Magic Midget" was produced by British Leyland to celebrate the racing pedigree of the MG and possibly transfer some of that aura of speed and success to the more modern incarnation of the MG Midget.

From its earliest days MGs have been used in competition and from the early 1930s a series of dedicated racing cars such as the 1931 C-Type and 1934 Q-type were made and sold to enthusiasts who received considerable company assistance.

This stopped in 1935 when MG was formally merged with Morris Motors and the Competition Department closed down.

A series of experimental cars had also been made allowing <u>Captain George Eyston</u> to take several world speed records. In spite of the formal racing ban, speed record attempts continued with Goldie Gardner exceeding 200 mph (320 km/h) in the 1100 cc EX135 in 1939.

After World War II record breaking attempts restarted with 500 cc and 750 cc records being taken in the late 1940s. A decision was also taken to return to racing and a team of MGAs was entered in the tragedy-laden 1955 24 Hours of Le Mans race, the best car achieving 12th place.


