Movie Night

We have been very fortunate in obtaining two excellent films of interest to Triumph owners for Saturday, September 24.

The first film will be loaned to us by Quaker State and is entitled "Road Racing's White Wave - the Story of Group 44." Group 44 and Triumph go way back - at least back to 1962 when Bob Tullius (honorary VTR member) joined them - and have taken a number of SCCA championships.

The film we are going to see was released in 1972 and should rouse the blood of every Triumph driver there ever was. In that year, Group 44 campaigned a TR-6, a GT-6, a Spitfire, and an MG-B. Backed by Quaker State and British Leyland, Group 44 has always been phenomenally successful. The film is approximately 30 minutes long.

The second film that we have obtained is an eleven minute feature film on the restoration facilities of one of the nation's foremost restoration shops: White Post Restorations of White Post, Virginia. Brochures on this film have already arrived and will be distributed with the September newsletter.

We recently tried to wedge an overdrive tranny into Bubba Brown's TR-3A without much success. The unit was a full-synchro transmission which, as we later found out, requires a TR-4 type rear mounting plate. Once the correct part was obtained, the fit was perfect.

After a year's absence, Bubba's TR-3A may be back on the road by the time you receive this newsletter.

One common performance modification to the Triumph head is to shave metal off the bottom face in order to raise the compression ratio. "Shaving" the head also removes any warpage present and assures that a proper seal is made to the head gasket and block.

A problem that often occurs with this modification is that of inadequate clearance between the rocker arms and the valves. If you run out of adjustment, obtain some .010" shim stock from your local auto parts store and use some tin snips to cut out shims to the shape of your rocker arm pedestals. Build up your shims evenly, being careful to drill the necessary holes for the oil passageway. This will give you adequate clearance for valve adjustments when you replace the rocker arms.

Restoration Tip

We are quite fortunate in having a Redi-Strip operation here in the Jackson area. Any of you who have had to hand-strip the gunk, paint, and rust off a car, as I have, knows how time consuming and miserable this work can be.
