NATCHEZ, MISS. - On October 14th, under picture-perfect blue skies and warm (low 80s) temperatures, the English Motoring Club of Mississippi hosted its 4th Annual "Brits on the Bluff" British Car Show and Competition in historic Natchez. It was the largest turnout yet for this small, but interesting, gathering, with 62 cars in place by noon.

A Concours d'Elegance-styled show judged by points, the event coincided with the city's Fall Pilgrimage Tour of antebellum mansions. Participants paraded through town under police escort to the show site - the city's new Main Street Marketplace, which resembles New Orleans' famous French Market.

British rarities on hand for viewing pleasure included a 1960 Armstrong Siddeley Star Sapphire Saloon, 1967 Aston Martin DB6, 1957 AC Bristol, 1964 Gordon Keeble signed by the designer (there are only four known examples in the U.S.), a 1958 MG ZB Magnette Saloon, and a 1949 Series A Singer "Nine" Roadster.


