This 22 minute film should show us not only the three factory TR-2's entered, but a few Austin-Healeys and Jaguars as well as many other famous racing cars of the era.

Racing fans will remember the 1955 Le Mans disaster when Levegh's 300SLR Mercedes collided with Macklin's Austin-Healey in a mixup involving Mike Hawthorn's Jaguar D type. The Mercedes disintegrated and pieces fell into the crowd, killing Levegh and eighty-one spectators. Stirling Moss took over the leading Mercedes and Ivor Bued replaced Mike Hawthorn in the D type. The D type eventually led to the fabrication of a much better won after Mercedes withdrew its cars, and all three TR-2's finished strongly.




