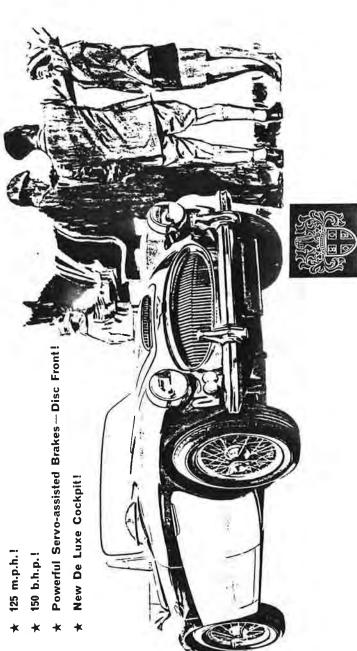

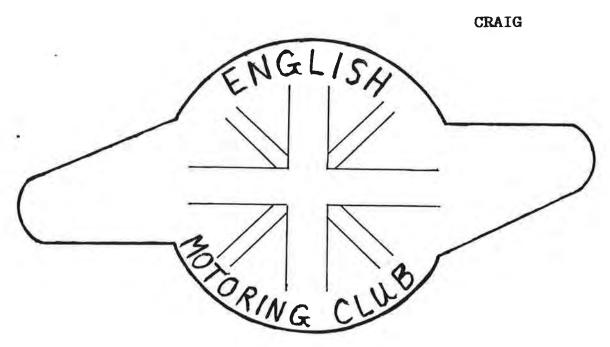

Dear Alex:

Thanks a bunch for the photo. I hope that by the time you see the old TR again it will be a little straighter and a little shinier. We had to spend so much time sorting out the mechanicals last year that we didn't get to pay too much attention to cosmetics.

We only made it to Sunday afternoon twice out of 6 races and we didn't get the problem solved until you saw us at Atlanta. We kept losing the bottom end -- usually during Saturday morning practice. It turned out to be bad machine work. The rod big ends were somewhat egg-shaped. However, three cranks and four total rebuilds later and we were okay.

The machine is pretty strong when it is up, though. We qualified first in class and sixth on the grid at Mid-Ohio -- ahead of the Healey Le Mans, all of the Porches and not too far back of the 317HP Aston and Henning's gawd-awful fast MGA. But we DNFed after lap 7 -- bottom end.

We didn't get a lap time on Saturday at Atlanta. We kept blowing oil lines. That's what we were trying to straighten out when you came by -- sorry if I seemed a little short of conversation but it gets a bit hectic when you're trying to sort out the car and make the grid. Anyway, we had gridded 13th overall for the qualifying race based on practice times. I think that was third in class out of a total field of over 40 cars. As a result of no time on Saturday afternoon, they started us dead last -- 34th. (You probably noticed.) Anyway, in spite of some lack of enthusiasm on my part we still managed to improve to 19th overall and 8th out of 18 in class. I

protested our grid position but you know how those things usually turn out. I think if we could have started somewhere in the middle, we might have won our class. We'll do better in '87.

A little information about the car. It's a '58 with relatively little modification. The engine is uprated to 2.2 liters and the head shaved to yield about 12:1. The combustion chamber has been worked to Kastner's specs for better flow. We were running the thinner steel head gasket during the first part of the season, but felt that compression was too high so we now run the stock gasket. We run light weight Isky push rods and Isky competition valve springs. We also run the Standard-Triumph "D" cam. It's not terribly wild and remains completely tractable for street use -- and I do drive it on the street. I'm sure that the valves will float but that doesn't happen until after somewhere 7,000. (Yes, I am ashamed!)

Carburetion started the year as 2 Webber 45 DCOE's, but we3 never could get them tuned properly. Now we are running the 1 3/4" SU's but on a late model TR4 manifold. We had to do a little under-bonnet body modification, but the 4 manifold flows a lot better than the 3. I think we will try to get the Weber's right and go back to them. They are supposed to be good for another 15-20 HP.

Suspension is competition springs with 1/2 coil removed in front and stock springs with an extra leaf in back. Shocks are Koni with the rear lever type having been replace by tube shocks. We use a 9/16" sway bar in Wheels are 72 spoke, 5 1/2" Kelsey-Hayes. main reason for these wheels is that they are much stronger than the originals. There has been a pretty fair amount of wheel breakage and SVRA recommends this Tires are 185-70 x 15 Comp T/A's at normal tread depth. Goodrich has a program under which they will supply a much stickier compound shaved to 1/2 depth but we haven't tried them. I don't know if I want it to Having raced midget and stick any tighter or not. quarter-midget dirt cars many years ago, I kind of like it to slide about some.

It's fast, it's a whole lot of fun and the handling is, shall we say, interesting -- kind of like trying to drive an articulated, double-hinged farm gate. But it does make that guy behind you think twice about attempting to pass that old blue car while it is slewing about a turn. If you have any interest and just even the slightest

ability, I strongly urge that you give it a try. It's a lot less expensive than you might think.

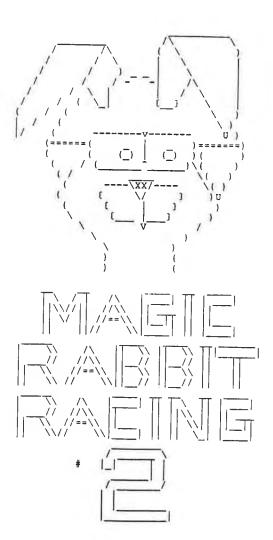

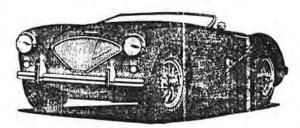
