Since the B has been having what appears to be a very small oil leak around the cylinder head, Charlie and Clay suggested at the November meeting that we check the cylinder head torque at the Christmas party. Around 11:00, Charlie and Donna arrived, and Charlie and I began a mini tech session, soon joined by Clay. After removing the spark plug wires (confirming the color was good in the process) and valve cover, we quickly confirmed that the nuts on all the cylinder studs were torqued to spec. After some discussion, we agreed that the leak is so minor that I'll just keep an eye on it for now. After some tutelage on the Rule of 9, we checked the valve adjustment. All of them turned out to be gapped a bit more than spec, so Charlie and I got them adjusted to the proper spacing. Once done, there was discussion with Clay about whether the silicone valve cover gasket that was installed only a few months ago needed to be replaced, and we decided to leave it. Since I have an alloy valve cover, Clay recommended I add an extra washer to each stud to keep them from bottoming out before the cover is fully tight, which is easily remedied by a quick trip to the hardware store. All in all, a quick, productive tech session. Much thanks to Charlie and Clay for their help!
