

After weeks of careful preparation, the Midget engine bay and bonnet underside were prepped and ready to paint. The Johnston brothers-Gene and Clay met me at Charlie's shop Friday afternoon, June 24th. We masked off the rest of the car and covered the floor area.

Brother Clay looking for any areas not covered well. Overspray is *not* our friend.




We reconvened bright and early Saturday morning for breakfast at the Huddle House before heading to Charlie's for the big day. After a final wipe down with Prep Sol and a going over with tack cloth the moment had arrived.

We used PPG MAE Omni acrylic enamel, a single stage paint. This was used on the exterior of the car in 2011 and still looks new. The difference is the engine bay and underside of the bonnet will be sprayed with PPG Omni production clear after the paint flashes to provide a bit more durability in the hot environs of the engine bay.





In spite of temperatures in the upper 90s and high humidity Gene did an excellent job of getting the paint to lay flat and smooth. From start to finish the respray took a little more than two and a half hours including time for each coat to flash, which didn't take long in the heat.

Here's the final result. She looks amazing and better still, no over spray or fish eye.




The brown Midget is owned by the fella who works in Kiev, Russia.




A Note from the President





I bought a 60 gallon compressor from Harbor Freight, along with a blast cabinet--Keith Anderson helped me get them home. I thought I could fit them both in the closet of my shop but that was not the case. Keith advised me to put the compressor outside due to the noise it will make so I began assembling the bast cabinet to test fit it into the closet. It just fits with room for my ladder on the side.



Over the next few weeks I constructed a concrete pad as a resting spot for the compressor on the back side of my shop. Thankfully I had had the shop wired for 220v when it was built, thinking I may one day install a lift, but the lift never happened, so I had plenty of spooled up wire to run to the compressor. The MG...the British car America fell in love and started the British car craze in the U.S., and after World War II some of the first MG cars ever seen by Americans stateside were some of the early MG -TC models. Here's EMC member John Lange pictured in his wonderful 1949 MG-TC a decade or so

ago at the New Orleans British Car Show.





Amanda swept the field in the model car contest at the Memphis British Car Show in 1990. She won with models of a Cobra Daytona coupe, 1957 Chevy and a 1959 TR-3. She built and painted all of the models herself. Judges were impressed when she told them about how she added windshield glass to the TR3 and put in a rear luggage compartment with spare tire in the Cobra.





All three models are on display at the slot car track at our shop in Vicksburg. One of the prizes in addition to the trophy is a 1/25 scale kit of a 289 Cobra that she and I built. That too is at the shop in a diorama of muscle cars.

Guest Commentary

(d) or even try 'head hunting' a few negotiators from Australia / Canada / USA etc. - who have recent experience. I' m afraid the one common theme is we don't seem to 'believe' Great Britain WAS, and could AGAIN be, a Great trading nation!

We also seem to have a problem with our 'media' - not least the BBC - who have been peddling 'gloom & despondency' - "The pound is falling.... lowest since..." "The FTSE is in Free Fall"... YES, the FTSE fell when the market opened @08.00 Friday, but the Governor of Bank of England gave reassurances and the market started to recover about 08.30. By close the FTSE was higher than at the start of the week... BUT the BBC stuck to 'bad day' story all thru the weekend!!

How did we manage to 'loose' Prime Minister, The leader of the Opposition ?? { Well 80% of his MPs have 'No Confidence' and 40 of the Shadow Cabinet resigned... } PLUS 'We' lost at football to Iceland - a nation with a population of an also ran UK City ?

STOP PRESS... Just heard Boris (Johnson) will NOT be standing for election as next leader / Prime Minister... { Is this a cheap comedy sketch? }

Better move onto your question Re Effect of Brexit on Classic Cars buyers / owners... 'Classic Car Weekly' (newspaper) has an article...

Editor says:- Values are unlikely to be hit by Brexit in short term, but EXPORTS are set to increase due to early adjustments in value of sterling.

FIVA recently announced its definition of a 'Historic Vehicle' - which was immediately and completely rejected by FBHVC !!

FIVA see a historic vehicle as 'very special', original to the point of NO modifications being allowed (even for 'safety' or to ensure the vehicle remains useable) AND would only be used very occasionally - for special occasions eg annual 'London to Brighton run'. { Hardly what we have a G-K for! }

So for you... It will be cheaper to buy further British classic cars, and ship them. { Because exchange rate is favourable}. It will be cheaper (short term) for you to buy parts for your British classics. - However, where parts are sourced from outside the UK the price may have to rise when stock is ordered / manufactured...and only the British element will then attract the exchange rate 'benefit'.

There may also be some 'easing' of rules / restrictions on 'nasty' materials & processes eg Asbestos in {old} brake linings, Use of chrome plating (and re-plating) for 'decorative' purposes.

From the Passenger Seat

Charlie and I were motoring about last weekend and decided to stop for a bite to eat in Hattiesburg. I ordered Red Beans and Rice, but was very disappointed. It made me wish I had given that restaurant this recipe! The original was contributed to Southern Sideboards cookbook by Mrs. E. B. Robinson, Jr. I've modified it a little—added sausage and tomatoes. If you don't have time to soak dried beans, canned red beans or kidney beans work just fine. You can also skip the ham and just use sausage for another shortcut. I hope you'll try it and enjoy every bite!

Donna's Favorite Red Beans and Rice

1 pound dried red beans	1 cup parsley, chopped	Dash of Tabasco sauce
1 meaty ham bone	2 large cloves garlic, crushed	1/4 teaspoon oregano
2 pounds link sausage	1 Tablespoon salt	1/4 teaspoon thyme leaves
3 cups chopped onions	Dash of red pepper	1 Tablespoon Worcestershire
1 bunch green onions, chopped	1/2 teaspoon sugar	sauce
1 Tablespoon salt	1 teaspoon black pepper	1/2 (8 oz. can tomato sauce
Cooked rice	Seasoned salt to taste	2 -15 1/2 cans of diced tomatoes

Soak beans overnight in water to cover. Drain. Cook beans and ham bone in water slowly for 3 hours. Add all ingredients except seasoned salt. Cook slowly for 1 1/2 hours. Cool. Reheat and simmer for 1 hour. Add seasoned salt to taste. For thicker red beans, remove a few beans from the pot. Mash beans and return to pot. This recipe may be prepared a day in advance and is better served the second day. Serve over cooked rice. Serves 8.
