






BRIGHTON BEACH PARTY "SMASHING" GOOD FUN!






BACK HOME IN INDIANA








OF "O" TYPES & HERLEYS




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


O.S.U.s VERSION OF THE "TECH" ARTICLE

Say, have you tried any of the resin or epoxy-based DRY LUBRICANTS? have been corresponding with the Sandstrom Corp for the past year, and have a liberal supply of their This is a non-"POXYLUBE 200". greasy film lubricant to replace petroleum type lubricants in applications where WD-40 or light oil or greasing is used. Needless to say, there are PLENTY of uses on a The stuf is GOOD and British car! LASTS! Kinda reminds me of putting a graphite coating on metal surfaces that doesn't get messy or come off. The metal must be CLEAN and OIL-FREE for the coating to stick properly.

For heavier-duty applications (splines and other load-bearing areas), they sell "COMPOUND 26A", which is also an air-dry product. For REALLY tough lubricating (they have even used this one on camshafts), there is an oven-dry prod-


These products are shelf-lifed, at 1 to 2 years, and if you use them, you have to remember to give up the petroleum lubes for that application (they don't mix). If interested, let your Editor know!

When I look at the Big Healey ReMake (son Geoff's "Healey Motor Corp"), it sure doesn't LOOK like a \$50,000 vehicle! In fact, the resemblance to the originals is remarkable.
