Our webpage lets you sample tracks and has media buttons which take you to Spotify, iTunes, Apple Music or CD Baby.



# Exhaust Rattles


This is not a LBC, but **Paul McNeill** is a faithful member and he had an unfortunate event while participating in an EMC fun drive.

### Suzy-B, My Latest MG!

#### What Makes One Buy an MG?

Let's begin where most likely many of us did, when reaching the age of getting my driver's license in 1972, I fell in love with the car. I sent off to British Leyland in NJ for a brochure and the pricing of the MGB and that was the beginning of my dream of owning the sports car. I had saved enough money to go to college by the time I graduated from HS, 1974 but it was either "college" or the new beautiful sports car, and being the practical person that I am, I chose the college route. That is how it all started.

I did however manage to drive an MGB for the first time when I got my girlfriend's maroon **B** running again in 1979. Upon graduation from College in 1980 I had a second chance to consider an MG so I went to a Texas foreign car dealer in Houston and test drove a B, but it was so dramatically slower, had those rubber bumpers, and was seriously underpowered, that I felt depressed and walked away from it.

Fast forward to 2000, and I see something under a tarp in a driveway and find out it doesn't run. The owner tells me it was heading for the junk yard. I make an offer of \$400 and tow it



to my garage in Stillwater, OK a few days later and have my first MG.

This was a 1971 chrome bumper Golden Bronze with wire wheels. Got it to run, changed the wheels to Rostyle and 2 years later had it about as good as it could be without going overboard and purchased a second one. The idea I had was to take the best of both cars and make one better car. Never finished that project because I purchased a third "dead in the garage" low mileage (28,000,

miles) never been wrecked, Carmine Red 1980 B with wire wheels for \$2000.

The 1980 was under boxes at the time in a garage and had not run in many years. It had unknowingly been used as a cat litter box. Got rid of the second one and the first one and kept the low mileage 1980 and moved it from OK to North Carolina. I bought a fourth MG-B in 2005, a white rusty 1974 with Rostyle wheels that I wanted to put on the 1980 B.

Then some changes in my life....that required a "fire sale" of the MGB, also known as a divorce. Less than a year later could not do without and bought a fifth MG; a 1980 Limited Edition for \$1000 from a friend who did not complete the project. I got it running, just barely, and then I too sold it because I had nowhere to work on it.

When I moved to **Mississippi** I wanted to have another sports car and looked around, but what I was looking at was not very good, until I found the **EMC**, and joined! I asked if anyone knew of a MGB that was looking for an owner and that brings me to my current car, a 1976 MGB, that I purchased on May 9, 2017, from former EMC club members, the **Enzman's.** 

I went to see the car in Bude, MS and liked it . A week later got a trailer and towed it back to Hattiesburg where the car now resides.



It took me nearly 2 weeks of every day fiddling with the car to get it started. I had exchanged many emails to **Keith Anderson** (whom I had not met at the time) and then joined in by other members of the EMC, until finally one frustrating Saturday morning, while I was sitting in my garage totally dumbfounded that this car would not start.....I got a call on my cell phone! "I hear you are having trouble getting your car started". And I thought which neighbor has been watching me and noticed I was in the garage with this car that I couldn't get to run. I asked, how do you know I cannot get my car started? And then **Clay Johnston** said in his kind southern voice, "I am a member of the car club and we heard about your situation!" Next thing you know, 45 minutes later, after **Clay and Charlie Durning** came down from Magee, Mississippi and got the car running in the next five minutes.... As you know, these two guys can make any MG sing and I now I have one that does just that!






What I had originally hoped was something I could drive around and have some fun with grew into something far more meaningful, as I have spent numerous Saturdays and a few Sundays at the **DG (Durning Garage).** I've made friends with **Steve, Clay, Charlie** by way of being auto mechanics. I've met other members as I have started to attend various events. This club has been a wonderful find, and if there is anyone who wants an MG or another British

car, you would find the EMC of Mississippi a great bunch of good folks to hang with! That is what I hope, to do more of, as the time goes on!

I have owned my car now for a little over a year, driven it as much as 700 miles in two days, and learned that the car is still as beautiful and satisfying as I had imagined in HS. I've tuned the carbs, set and polished the valves, adjusted the timing, changed the oil, replaced the radiator, messed with wires, spilled oil everywhere, brought it back to original wheels (apparently I have a thing for Rostyle wheels).



And I'm still trying to get the oil to stop leaking— something that brings on a laugh among MG owners! Still have that as a goal! I named my car **"Suzy-B"** and drive her regularly, have an appreciation for the car, but more importantly, an appreciation of the people who own them. Cheers + Very cool and get an MG if you don't already have one!


