## Spares News

In case you haven't followed your Moss Motors Newsletters or The Roadster Factory updates, we have many new spares available now and coming soon for your car.

Moss now offers TR-2/3 striker plates at \$12.95, TR-4 trunnions at \$47.50, and TR-2/3 seat slides at \$29.95 each. They also have quite a few Austin Healey parts including 100-4 door locks at \$23.50, 100-4 "Le Mans" bonnet straps at \$45.95, BJ8 glove box locks at \$22.95, and BJ8 vent glass at \$43.25 each.

The Roadster Factory is also hard at work! At hand is an exciting new project to make a production run of TR-250/6 frames at a factory in Pennsylvania. As they offer practically every other part for a TR-6, it would be possible to build a

The Roadster Factory is also looking into reproducing the teardrop escutcheon for the TR-2/early 3 and may reproduce the stainless steel grille surround for these early Triumphs if enough interest is shown.

If anyone is looking for a good Triumph spare project, I would recommend reproducing the TR-2/3 steering wheel. Moss was to have looked into this a year or so ago, but none have hit the market yet.
