Brian is working on Jager Smith's '68 Austin Healey Sprite so that it may be shown for the tenth year in a row at the Eurofest car show. The car was completely restored in 2003 and has been a Eurofest winner many times. But a clutch problem required that the drivetrain be pulled for inspection. We found that the pressure plate had come apart inside the bellhousing because the driven flange had separated from the diaphragm fingers. This caused the exposed diaphragm fingers to grind the carbon throw-out bearing into dust. A new clutch kit was installed along with new front shocks and some brake work and, so the Sprite will be ready for the upcoming Eurofest show.







This year was no exception regarding attendance and even more surprising that in the rainy weather brought on by Tropical Storm Gordon, there were 161 cars on the show field.

I didn't arrive in time to go on the driving tour of the AR wine country but the **Cashmans** and I did make the group driving tour to Crystal Bridges. It is a premier art gallery in this country and it does not disappoint with the awesome collection of art by American artists. Also on the grounds of the museum is a Frank Lloyd Wright house that was purchased in NJ and brought to Bentonville and reassembled. Quite impressive architecture! The drive took us along scenic NW AR roads and stops included the Hobbs State Park Conservancy in

The **Cashmans** and I decided to do more sightseeing and drove over to Eureka Springs. We stopped at Pea Ridge Military Park, the Western most battlefield of the Civil War. The South lost the battle and Missouri was secured for the Union. From there we pressed on and barely made it to the Thorncrown Chapel as it was closing. The Chapel was designed by renowned architect E. Fay Jones. Recently, members of the American Institute of Architects placed Thorncrown Chapel fourth on its list of the top buildings of the twentieth century. Over 6 million people have visited this sanctuary since it opened in 1980.

From the Chapel we made our way to downtown Eureka Springs where we visited The Crescent Hotel, known for its haunting stories of days gone by and where from the balcony bar you can spy The Christ of the Ozarks statue across the mountains. We had a great dinner at Sparkey's and made our way back to the host hotel in Springdale. This day was jam packed with sightseeing and I loved it—so fun spending the day with **Pat and Barbara** too.

At the awards ceremony the **Cashmans** received 2nd Place in their class for their Gordon Keeble and 1st Place was awarded to a Marcos car owner. In addition, the club president called Pat and the Marcos owner to the front to receive a special award for having the most rare cars at the show.

## From the Passenger Seat





Fall is here! And with that, our minds start turning to comfort food and good-ole casseroles, complete with cream of mushroom soup! This month, I decided to share my favorite Corn-Rice Casserole recipe with you. I hope you enjoy it! -DD

#### **Corn-Rice Casserole**

- 2 cups uncooked long-grain rice
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 (15 1/2 oz.) can cream-style corn
- 1 (11 oz.) can Mexican-style corn, drained
- 1 (11 oz.) can whole kernel corn, drained
- 1 (10 oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chiles, undrained (I like Rotel original)
- 1 (8 oz) loaf Mexican Velveeta
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/3 tsp pepper
- 1/2 cup shredded mild cheddar cheese

Cook rice according to package directions. Melt butter in a large skillet over meeium heat. Add bell pepper and onion. Saute' 5 minutes or until tender. Stir in cooked rice, creamstyle corn, and next 6 ingredients. Spoon into a lightly greased 3 1/2 quart baking dish.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Top with shredded cheese and bake 5 more minutes or until cheese melts.

Makes 10-12 servings Preparation time 25 minutes Bake time 35 minutes
