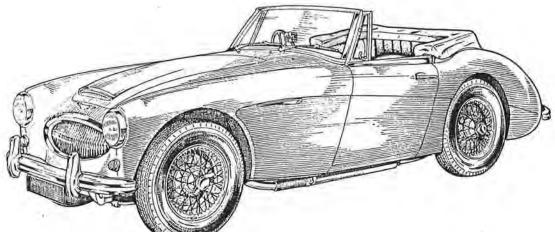

TECH TIP

One of the best ways to get your TR-3 to run cooler is to block the bypass hose between the water pump and the thermostat housing - we previously ran an article on how to do that by threading the water pump outlet and inserting a threaded pipe plug.

A simpler solution was developed by EMC's Frank Peel - simply tape a nickle over the bypass inlet to the thermostat housing and clamp the bypass hose over the tape. Don't knock it - it works!
