This will be a Concours d'Elegance (points) judged show using the following criteria:

- 10 points - Engine/engine compartment
- 10 points - Wheels and tires
- 10 points - Paint
- 10 points - Undercarriage
- 10 points - Upholstery and carpets
- 10 points - Chrome
- 10 points - Body including top
- 10 points - Glass
- 10 points - Instruments and dash
- 10 points - Authenticity

All categories other than authenticity are judged on condition only.

Best of Show - High-point car.

"Show Stopper" -- The vehicle which attracts the most attention of the individual attendees regardless of overall condition.


