MG International -Indy '96

I'm not sure, but the MG International - Indy 96 event could have been the largest group of MG cars ever assembled in one spot on the face of the earth!

The judging took place on Friday June 29. There were over 1,100 MGs on the field. The agreement was that the first 1,000 to register would be permitted to drive on the Indy 500 race track on Saturday. Well, on Saturday there were over 1,300 MGs that showed up to drive on the track. The track was scheduled to open at 8:00 a.m. Of course, everyone wanted to be one of the first ones on the track (including me). Needless to say there was a tremendous traffic jam around 8:00 a.m. This was compounded because the track was one hour late opening the gate! All streets in all directions were saturated with MGs. This was something to see!

Back to the show. It offered both popular and concours judging. Only thirteen cars showed up for the concours. In the concours class there were only three trophies: 1st place and two honorable mentions. Jim and Geradine Wiggins from Bloomington, Minnesota took first place. Hiram Sheppard from the Memphis club won an honorable mention with his freshly restored MGB in

British racing green. The people I recognized at the show were Hiream Sheppard and Jack Reynolds from Memphis, Bob and Sue Mason from Fairhope, Alabama and Richard Decreaval from Gulf Breeze, Florida. Bob and Sue did not take a car. I saw cars there from just about every state except Alaska. My car was the only one from Mississippi. There were only two from Alabama. A large group of cars was from Texas and Florida.

One of the interesting points of the show was the location itself. This fellow by the name of Fred Ropkey owns a large spread of land on the Western side of Indianapolis. He also has a private military museum of WW II vintage. I was amazed to see that everything is being kept in full operating condition except for a few anti- aircraft guns which were stored outside. He had everything from a military bicycle to a NASA capsule floating in an adjoining lake. I cannot name everything in his collection but I did see nine tanks, jeeps trucks, PT boat, Coast Guard cutter, T-34 aircraft, a large guided missle from the early '60s, Harley Davidson motor cycles, and a Cushman Eagle scooter.

I found Mr. Ropkey to be a very interesting person to talk to. If you haven't guessed by now he was a tank commander in the Marines! He also owns two MGs (TD series).

If you are in the area, it is worth the time to visit. It is shown by appointment only. He is in the yellow pages under "Graphics".

A nice 100% cotton shirt with two colors of artwork (red & blue) will be only \$16.00.


There is a 12 working day turn around. I will order only large and extra large sizes which should fit most people and simplify the order.


Once we agree on the design I suggest sending payment to EMC, P.O. Box 5263, Jackson, MS., 39216.


